KNIFE ARREST

Officers from the Sutton Safer Parks Team had just completed a patrol of Beddington Park when their attention was drawn to two (2) males on Manor Road. The males were acting suspiciously and known for drug and knife related offences. One of the males was seen to reach into a bush and retrieve what was believed to be a knife. The males were both stopped and searched under section 1 PACE.

One (1) of the males found to be in possession of a knife with a 5" blade. The male was arrested for points and blades.

PARCEL DOORSTEP THEFT ARREST

A member of the public called through to the Sutton South ward SNT stating that a parcel had just been stolen from the doorstep. Sutton South SNT officers went straight to the location and got the informant to send through the CCTV which was checked en-route via the officer's mobile device. Officers have seen a male matching the description walking away from the scene so have stopped him and found the stolen items in the bag he was carrying. The suspect was arrested and taken to custody and was later charged with theft.

OVERTON PARK

Officers from the Sutton Safer Parks Team patrolled Overton Park this evening and stopped a male who was found in possession of cannabis. He was issued with a Community Resolution.

As a result officers investigated the matter which resulted in a Section 5 public order offense taking place. The offenders are due to be issued with a Penalty Notice Disorder (PND) and an Anti-Social Behaviour Warning (ASBW)

TRAFFIC OPERATION



Local Officers from the St Helier, Wandle Valley and The Wrythe local policing teams conducted a traffic operation in their areas, targeting speeding motorists and other vehicle crime. The officers were joint by colleagues from the emergency response team at Sutton.

The vehicle checks were conducted on Wrythe Lane, Green Wrythe Lane and Middleton Road. During the operation four penalty tickets were issued to drivers for not wearing their seat belts, and one driver was summoned to court for failing to stop & wearing no seat belt.

In addition to this, two drivers were given words of advice in relation to their speed. It was noted that most motorists were very good with their speed.



QUEEN MARYS PARK

Following recent complaints of youths taking drugs in Queen Marys Park, officers from The Sutton Safer Parks Team have been conducting regular patrols. As a result groups of youths have been stopped in the park and searched on two separate occasions.

On one occasion a group of five youths were stopped. The group were subject to a search under the Misuse of Drugs Act. During the search one male was found in possession of cannabis and was issued with a community resolution.

On a second occasion two males were stopped and subjected to a drugs search.

On this occasion a male was found in possession of cannabis and issued with a Community Resolution. The team are continuing to monitor the area and resolve the issues

BEDDINGTON PARK STOP

Officers from The Sutton Safer Parks team were patrolling Beddington Park when they stopped a male acting suspicious after being seen to appear to hide items upon seeing police. The male was subject to a search and found in possession of a lock



knife and multiple mobile phones and other electrical equipment. Further checks on the male revealed that he had strict bail conditions in relation to these devices. The male was arrested for being in possession of a lockable knife, for which he later received a caution. He is also currently under further investigation for other matters.

FAILING TO STOP AND DRUG SUPPLY ARREST

Officers were patrolling along Brighton Road Sutton when their attention was drawn to a suspicious vehicle at the junction of Cedar Road, which was waiting to turn right onto Brighton Road. On spotting police the driver of the vehicle changed direction by turning left on to Brighton Road, heading towards the A217. The vehicle then turned into Grange Vale at speed whereby items appeared to be discarded from the vehicle. The vehicle then failed to stop and drove into Overton Park, whereby there was only two occupants within the vehicle, who attempted to escape from police however both were detained for searches under section 23 misuse of drugs act 1971.

The passenger of the vehicle was found in possession of a shoulder bag, in the bag was a large quantity of empty snap bags, a set of scales with green remnants on and £255.00 in cash. Also found inside the bag was a very small quantity of herbal cannabis. The passenger was subsequently arrested for possession of cannabis. Upon a further search of the passenger an item could be felt concealed in his pants which was later retrieved via a strip search in custody, 27 grams worth of cannabis with the street value of £180.00. The passenger was subsequently further arrested for Possession with Intent to Supply Class B Drugs and taken to custody. The driver of the vehicle was arrested for failing the roadside drug test and other driving offences & was also arrested on suspicion of Possession with intent to supply Class B Drugs. The arrest was made possible from information gained by officers from the local policing team Cheam and Belmont wards who received and developed the information

FAIRLANDS PARK

The Sutton Safer Parks Team visited Fairland's Park following recent concerns about cannabis use in the park. One male was stopped and searched under the Misuse of Drugs Act. He was found in possession of cannabis and issued a Community Resolution



CHEAM VILLAGE DRUG STOP

Officers from the Sutton Safer Parks Team were on patrol in the Cheam area.

Officers pulled into the car park off

Anne Boleyn's Walk and as they did so noticed a group of males congregating behind The Charity for Civil servants building. Upon seeing police the group immediately dispersed and ran off. Two of the group were stopped and subject to searches. One male was found in possession of cannabis and received a £90 Fixed Penalty Ticket



CHEAM PARK

Officers from The Sutton Safer Parks Team have been patrolling Cheam Park following numerous complaints about drugs use and other anti social behaviour. As a result of the see patrols officers from the Sutton Safer parks Team had cause to stop a male who and he was subject to a search under the Misuse of Drugs Act. He was found in possession of cannabis and given a community resolution.

On a separate occasion officers from the Sutton Safer Parks Team were patrolling Cheam Park when they had cause to stop a group of males who attempted to run away. The group of

three males were searched and one was found in possession of cannabis. He was issued with a Fixed Penalty Ticket of £90
