TRAFFIC STOP

Officers from the East cluster Safer Neighbourhoods Team and St Helier ward were conducting a traffic operation in the Rosehill area. During the operation a vehicle was stopped for driving without insurance. Following further checks it was also discovered that the driver was driving whilst disqualified, in addition to this he was subjected to a search and found to be in possession of cannabis and Class A drugs, believed to be cocaine. The driver was arrested for driving whilst disqualified, driving without insurance, Possession With Intent to supply cannabis and possession of Class A drugs.

In addition to this his vehicle was seized for driving without insurance.

HOT PURSUIT

Local Neighbourhood officers on Winter night patrols over the Christmas period spotted a moped which was suspected as possibly dealing in the Belmont area. The rider spotted police and disappeared into the Shanklin Estate. Officers searched the area and spotted the suspect on a moped. The suspect abandoned the moped and ran off into Belmont Park. Officers were in hot pursuit and detained him further in the park. The male was subject to a drugs search and was found to be in possession of a few wraps of cannabis. However, this seemed a bit strange to the officers who requested a dog unit. The dog unit then searched the surrounding area along the route that the suspect had taken and recovered a bag containing 13 wraps of cannabis as well as a few other individual wraps found very close to where he was detained. As a result of this good work, the male was arrested for Possession With Intent to Supply Cannabis. A further search of the suspect was conducted at a police station where he was also found in possession of a large amount of white powder and further arrested for possession with intent to Supply Class A drugs. Officers then conducted a search at the suspects home address where more cannabis was found.
